Its mission is to develop disease-oriented clinical and translational research programs in focused disease areas. SICS aims to attract, train and nurture clinician-scientists and serves as a critical bridge linking basic research undertaken by A*STAR Research Institutes and clinical research programmes in Singapore's public hospitals, disease centres and the universities. SICS has two main research programmes namely, the **Infection and Immunity Programme** and the **Growth, Development and Metabolism Programme**.

Statistician

As a member of the GDM programme, your main role as a Statistician is to provide research support in the area of data management and analysis. Your main role will be to create and manage databases, analyze data using common statistical software and present data using appropriate tables and figures. You will also be responsible for handling data requests to and from collaborators and assist in the development and pilot-testing of research questionnaires. You would also be required to perform literature review on specific research topics and summarize research findings in clear and concise reports.

Requirements:

- A Bachelor or Masters degree in science, statistics or related field
- Relevant work experience will be a bonus but not essential
- Possess basic statistical knowledge and familiar with at least one common statistical software (e.g. SPSS, R, Stata)
- A responsible and dependable individual who pays attention to details and is willing to learn
- Shows initiative and able to work independently as well as part of a team
- Possess good verbal and written communication skills
